## Summary:

Hearing Officer Andrew Bell opened the hearing. Henrietta Stern provided an overview of the application, CEQA Notice of Exemption, Draft Findings and Conditions of Approval. Stern identified text corrections and refinements for clarity (Finding #11, #12); Bell asked that the word "exceeds" be replaced with the words "does not meet" regarding secondary water quality standards referenced in Finding #10 and Condition #14. The applicant was asked to review her letter of November 19, 2004 in which a different production limit allocation is requested for Condition #3 (see attached Order Following Hearing). Stern noted that if the 1994 Grice Report is the basis to quantify residential use, the value of 0.444 AFY should be used, not the rounded up value of 0.5 AFY. Stern reviewed the assumptions used by Grice to yield the 0.444 value. Laredo noted that the Hearing Officer should rule on the question of whether the 0.444 AFY includes indoor and associated residential landscaping. A letter from Carole January Erickson was summarized, and Kemp responded to concerns raised in the Erickson letter. Bell indicated he wished to carefully review the 1994 Grice Report, and would issue a written determination no later than November 24, 2004. Bell approved the application on November 24, 2004 with corrected Final Findings (#10, #11 and #12) and revised Final Conditions of Approval (#3, #14) dated November 24, 2004. As described in attached Order Following Hearing, the potable component shall be 0.444 AFY for indoor and outdoor residential use, and the nonpotable component shall be 14.466 AFY for agricultural irrigation.
