- Consider more exemptions.




Definitions and Acronyms



- MPWRS = Monterey Peninsula Water Resource System
- CVAA = Carmel Valley Alluvial Aquifer
- SGB = Seaside Groundwater Basin
- SER = Sensitive Environmental Receptors
- System Limits = annual water production and connection limits
- Critical habitat = habitat required for endangered or threatened species



District Areas





Existing WDS Rules



- Exemptions from setting a System Limit and conducting CEQA review apply in very limited circumstances
- For most wells, current Rules require:
 - pre-application & application (\$3,500 to \$5,000)
 - notification of nearby properties
 - hydrogeologic testing and report (\$5k \$10k)
 - CEQA and legal review
 - Permit with System Limits (production and connection limit)



Existing WDS Rules



Review Levels

- ➤ 153 different combinations of property size, parcels, water use, and location
- only four combinations are exempt
- ➤ Exemption: no WDS Permit needed; System Limits are set based on historical use
- ➤ WDS Permit: includes CEQA review; System Limits are set based on hydrogeologic testing and analysis; testing is limited to dry season (normally June 1 through November 30)



District Authority



- District can regulate all water systems
- in the absence of a declared overdraft or other physical or legal constraint, District may not have authority to set System Limits in some areas
- within MPWMD, this concept applies most often to percolating groundwater outside of the MPWRS
- areas within MPWRS have legal constraints where System Limits are appropriate



Staff Proposal



- Combine Pre-Application and Application (one step)
- Expand exemptions; simplify permit categories
- Extra review if within 1,000 feet of SER
- Revise SER definition to include all sources to the MPWRS
- General Manager to approve exemptions and permits unless the WDS is large or complex (all decisions remain appealable to the Board)
- Applications for 4 or more parcels will still require a WDS Permit (District law)
- No change for facilities relying on the CVAA or the Seaside Groundwater Basin



Proposed Permit Pathways



- ➤ Exemptions: < 3 parcels (no System Limits)</p>
 - Type A must be outside of MPWRS buffer
 - Type B if within MPWRS buffer, must not have adverse effect on MPWRS
- Permit Examples:
 - Type C 4 or more parcels outside of MPWRS buffer; SGB wells < 5 AFY; no System Limits
 - Type D if within MPWRS or buffer, testing and review, System Limits may be set
- Note: these examples do not cover all situations see Exhibit C



Benefits to Property Owners



- Reduce duplication with Monterey County
 - MPWMD to coordinate with Monterey County on new well ordinance
 - ➤ Include criteria for potential impacts of wells in a 1,000foot buffer zone around MPWRS sources
 - MPWMD would rely on Monterey County assessments for wells that do not affect MPWRS
- Cost reduction to applicants
 - > Reduce hydrogeologic tests and simplify legal review



Benefits to MPWMD



- Most applications could be processed with a simple review and an exemption
- Exemptions would have reduced set of standard conditions
- Minimal staff review for exemptions meeting certain criteria
- Reduced timeline for exemptions and some permits



Continued monitoring and data assessment









Staff Recommendation



- > Concur with staff proposal and/or provide guidance.
- Direct staff to prepare draft ordinance for Rules & Regulations Review Committee.
- Direct staff to conduct CEQA review on first reading of an ordinance for future Board consideration (early 2014).
- Provide the General Manager with the discretion to waive setting System Limits for qualified non-MPWRS applications currently in progress.
