

Drought Monitor – October 14, 2014


U.S. Drought Monitor California

More than 58 percent of the State is in Exceptional Drought, including **Monterey** County.

 - Weak El Niño event will likely develop between the November and January timeframe
 - Weak El Niño does not produce higher than normal rainfall
 - So. California may be wetter than last year
 - Conditions favorable for another high pressure area over Northern California
 - Central Coast located in neutral area

Water use continues to drop in Monterey County, state

State still falls short of the 20 percent decline officials want

SALINAS >> Californians' water use continues to decline, new data from a state agency show.

In August, residents and businesses decreased their water usage by 11.5 percent compared to a year ago, with continuing reductions in Monterey County, data released Tuesday by the State Water Resources Control Board show.

Water board officials called the statewide improvement "a significant jump from the 7.5 percent reported in July and 4 percent in June, as compared to a year ago."

On the Monterey Peninsula, where the area is already under stiff water restrictions, usage continued to drop in June, July and August compared to the year before.

Even though their water use is already lower than much of the state, Peninsula customers of California American Water Co. managed to further cut usage by 10 percent in August compared to last year.

Salinas businesses and residents did even better, with customers of California Service Water Co. using 14 percent less this August.

In the north Monterey Bay area, the city of Santa Cruz has implemented water rationing with penalties for going over household limits, and was lauded by the water board as "noteworthy" for lowering its August water use by 28 percent compared to last year.

 - Positive action hose nozzles required
 - No washing of hard outdoor surfaces
- Door hangers
- Trade flier for landscapers/gardeners
