# Overview

- Purpose of the Stakeholder meetings
  - Advance planning! Old plan needs revisiting.
  - Begin dialogue on rationing options
    - No rationing is expected in near term
    - Cal-Am is required by the Public Utilities Commission to have a rationing plan

# Overview

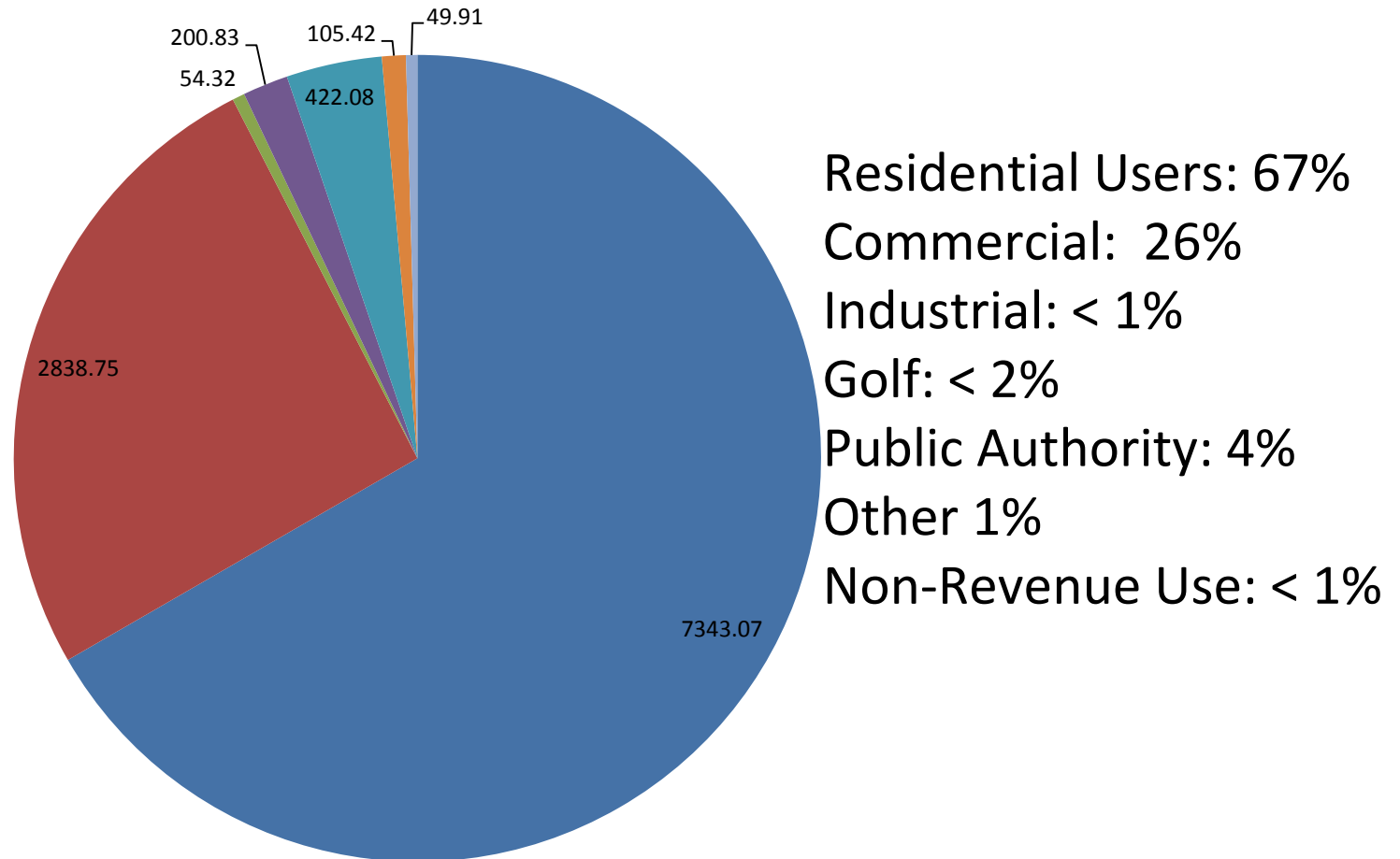
- Expanded Water Conservation and Standby Rationing Plan (CAW Rule 14.1.1), adopted in 1999
- Residential Users have priority (minimum of 35 gppd) after accounting for Unaccounted Water Use and District reserve
- Remainder to all other users

# Overview

- Current plan uses Cal-Am allotments
- Cal-Am is moving away from allotments in 2013
  - Allotments have been problematic
    - May over or under estimate actual needs
    - Self reporting to Cal-Am is not always accurate
- Without allotment information, another method of rationing non-residential users is needed
