### 1. CALL TO ORDER/ROLL CALL

MEMBERS PRESENT: Lance Monosoff, Thomas House, Frank Pierce, Larry Levine, and

Margaret Robbins

MEMBERS ABSENT: Vincent Frumkin

2. PUBLIC COMMENT – Larry Hampson stated that Andrew Clarke was a new MPWMD Board member who would be appointing a member to the Committee.

- 3. CONSENT CALENDAR Larry Levine made a motion to approve the minutes from the January 23, 2014 Regular Meeting, and was seconded by Margaret Robbins. **The minutes were approved by a unanimous vote.**
- 4. ELECTION OF CHAIR FOR THE REMAINDER OF FISCAL YEAR 2014 2015-Thomas House made a motion to elect Lance Monosoff for Chair and was seconded by Frank Pierce. **The motion to approve Lance Monosoff as Chair passed by a 5-0 vote.** Thomas House made a motion to elect Larry Levine for Vice-Chair and was seconded by Margaret Robbins. **The motion to approve Larry Levine as Vice-Chair passed by a 5-0 vote.**
- 5. UPDATE AND DISCUSSION ON CARMEL RIVER WATERSHED CONSERVANCY ACTIVITIES Lorin Letendre stated the CRWC is working with a new MIIS intern Whitney Berry to help with CRWC projects. He also stated that the CRWC is working with Bill Kamp and the Tri County Heritage group on the concept of California Heritage Areas to celebrate cultural, historical, and ecological benchmarks of the Carmel River Watershed.

Larry Levine suggested that CRWC check in with Meg Clovis (Monterey County Cultural Affairs Manager) about their work on heritage areas.

#### 6. STAFF REPORTS –

A. Monterey Peninsula Water Supply Projects – Larry Hampson stated Deep Water Desal's EIR will take one year to complete.

Larry Hampson also stated that the Pure Water Monterey project (Groundwater Replenishment Project) needs multiple agreements between MPWMD, Monterey County Water Resources Agency, and the City of Salinas to move forward. It will

also need an EIR that should be complete in the first quarter of next year. This project could supply up to 3,500 acre-feet of water per year for injection into the Seaside Groundwater Basin.

With regards to Cal-Am's Desal project, Larry Hampson stated that a court was deciding if Cal-Am could have access to the Cemex property for drilling the test slant well.

- B. Update on the Riparian Corridor and Vegetation Management Thomas Christensen stated that Vegetation Management activities took place at five areas (Valley Greens Bridge, Schulte Bridge, Boronda Bridge, Esquiline Bridge, and Ward Bridge) to help clear the channel for winter flows. He also stated that certain stands of riparian vegetation were under irrigation to help prevent desiccation near Cal-Am's main pumping wells.
- C. Update on Cal-Am's 2015-2017 General Rate Case Activities in the Carmel River Larry Hampson stated that Cal-Am had requested \$4.2 million to install downstream steelhead passage at Los Padres Reservoir. In addition, Cal-Am requested \$1 million to co-fund a feasibility study with MPWMD on the future of Los Padres Dam.
- D. Update on San Clemente Dam Removal and Reroute Project Thomas Christensen updated the group that Granite plans to stop work for the season on San Clemente Dam on December 15, 2014. In addition, Thomas Christensen stated that Granite has completed the reroute cut in preparation for winter flows. Granite has stated that work is scheduled to begin May 15, 2015.
