#### **Cost Controls**


- MRWPCA Project Management Savings
  - Internal costs much less than \$200/hr for outside project management
  - ➤ Avoid Consultant mark up of 10 to 15%
  - Pick and choose most productive consultants
  - Expect roughly \$1 million in project savings
- Four reviews to refine budget




#### **MRWPCA Proposed Groundwater Replenishment Project Phasing**

- Keeps project on schedule for early 2017 completion
- Helps us qualify for proposed low interest State SRF loan
  - >1% loan in 2015
  - >Save about \$200/AF
