Saving Water is Our Way of Life

Water is a limited, yet precious, resource on the Monterey Peninsula. California American Water and the Monterey Peninsula Water Management District are dedicated to helping customers reduce water bills and preserve our limited water supply. Our commitment is to promote environmental stewardship and provide high-quality water service – one drop at a time.

Conserving one of our most vital, yet limited, resources requires everyone's help. We know there are many ways you are saving water and avoiding unnecessary water waste. Below are a few basic reminders that protect this precious resource, save you money on your water bills and will help you avoid citations:

OUTSIDE WATERING

- Water lawns, gardens and plants between 5 p.m. and 9 a.m. during dry spells. Use drip irrigation or water by hand with a shut-off hose nozzle.
- Minimize your outdoor water needs by converting your lawn to a more water-efficient landscape.



- Keep water use within rationing limits during times of mandatory water rationing.

Keep water use within the limits of your Water Budget. If your landscape has undergone a Landscape Water Audit and has a Water Budget.

- Use a broom or rug to clean driveways, patios, buildings, or other hard surfaced areas instead of washing them with a hose.

Clean your car at a commercial car wash location. If you have to wash your car at home, use a hose with a shut-off nozzle.

- Use a hose with a shut-off nozzle when washing livestock.

LEAKS AND RUNOFF

- Fix leaks and breaks. A broken pipe or even a small leak can result in hundreds of gallons of wasted water.
- Turn off the water when not in use. Water should not be wasted or allowed to run off properties.

CHANGES IN NUMBER OF RESIDENTS

- Report changes in the number of permanent residents in a home to California American Water.

BUSINESSES

- Commercial car washes should recycle at least 50 percent of the water used per cycle.

Commercial vehicles should be washed at facilities that minimize wasteful water use.

- Use non-potable water for street cleaning.

Except in cases of emergency, do not transport water away from the Monterey Peninsula.

There may be times in which water may appear to be wasted, yet these occasions are typically not considered wasteful uses of water.

- Water used for firefighting, fire training activities, or inspection of fire hydrants.

Water used to prevent or resolve health, safety or accident hazards.

- Water from storm runoff.

Water used for dust control.
