**Subject: Request for Additional Monterey County District Rebate Funds**

Dear Monica:

The Monterey Peninsula Water Management District (MPWMD) requests California American Water (CAW) to file an Advice Letter with the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) to secure additional funding in the amount of \$250,000 for water conservation Rebates in the Monterey County District. MPWMD, which administers the Monterey District Rebate Program, has exhausted the funds available from the 2009-2011 Conservation Program Budget (A.07-12-010).

The CPUC approved \$924,925 for rebates in the 2009-2011 Conservation Budget. As of January 12, 2011, CAW has paid \$726,826 for rebates invoiced by MPWMD. This amount covers rebates issued by MPWMD through October 2010. MPWMD processed an additional \$165,907 through December 2010 that has not yet been invoiced to CAW. In addition, MPWMD is in receipt of rebate applications for the first eleven days of January 2011 that are estimated at more than \$40,000, although not all applications will qualify for a rebate. At such time as the total budgeted amount is expended, MPWMD will hold the remaining applications until funding is reinstated.

The Settlement Agreement for the Conservation Program Budget (Section 5-C) allows CAW to "file an advice letter to increase the budget by the rate of overspending, or \$250,000, which ever is smaller." Please request the full \$250,000 immediately. At the current participation level (approximately \$60,000-\$80,000 per month), \$250,000 will support the Rebate Program for approximately four months, through April 2011. Funding for the Rebate Program is included in the pending General Rate Case for 2012-2014.

The Rebate Program is a successful conservation project that results in significant water savings and contributes to the community's compliance with regulatory restrictions. Continued CAW support for the program ensures ongoing community participation. Thank you for your immediate attention to this matter.



**Background:**

On May 21, 2009, The California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) issued Decision No. 09-05-029. Submission of these tariffs is made per page Ordering Paragraph (1. d.) of this Decision which states:

“One hundred percent of the \$924,925 Rebate budget and the associated \$50,000 for the Weather Based Irrigation Controller pilot study shall be used for rebate dollars given to customers. If after one year California-American Water Company has spent more than one third of this amount, or after two years California-American Water Company has spent more than two-thirds of this amount, and projects that it will overspend in this category, California-American Water Company may file an advice letter to increase the budget by the rate of overspending, or \$250,000, whichever is smaller.”

As stated in a letter dated January 13, 2011 from the Monterey Peninsula Water Management District (MPWMD), see Workpapers 7-1, the CPUC approved conservation budget for Rebates of \$924,925 has been exhausted as of January 2011. As of November 2010, California American Water has paid MPWMD a total of \$726,826 and as of December 2010, MPWMD has not yet invoiced California American Water for \$165,907 for a total budget spend by the end of 2010 of \$892,733 leaving a remaining budget for January 2011 of \$32,192. MPWMD currently holds receipts for January 2011 which total about \$40,000 which exceeds the budget by about \$8,000.

At the current participation levels as outlined in MPWMD's letter of approximately \$60,000 to \$80,000 each month, increasing the budget by \$250,000 will support the Rebate Program for approximately 4 months or through April 2011.

California American Water is currently billing customers a surcharge of \$0.0147 as approved in Advice Letter 761. The surcharge is assessed to all Monterey water customers, including the Monterey main system and the subsystems of Ambler, Bishop, Hidden Hills, Ryan Ranch, Ralph Lane, Chualar and Toro.

**Request:**

California American Water is requesting authorization to increase the conservation budget by \$250,000 as authorized by the CPUC in Decision No. 09-05-029 for California American Water's Monterey District.

California American Water proposes to increase the current volumetric surcharge of \$0.0147 per 10 cf to \$0.0191 per 10 cf, an increase of \$0.0044 per 10 cf. This increase is being requested to collect the \$250,000 increase as authorized for its conservation efforts directly related with the Rebate Program, plus \$661 in uncollectibles expense for a total of \$250,661. The annual increase is \$250,661, which is 0.58% above Monterey's current authorized operating revenues per Advice Letter 868. This proposed increase would increase Monterey's current adopted operating revenues of \$43,447,492 to \$43,698,153.

**Tier Designation:**

These tariffs are submitted pursuant to General Order No. 96-B and this advice letter is designated as a Tier 1 filing.

**Effective Date:**

California American Water requests that the tariffs discussed above, be made effective January 14, 2011

**Service List:**

In accordance with Section 4.3 of General Order 96-B, a copy of this advice letter has been served upon all interested and affected parties as shown in Exhibit A.

**Protest and Responses:**

Anyone may respond to or protest this advice letter. A response supports the filing and may contain information that proves useful to the Commission in evaluating the advice letter. A protest objects to the advice letter in whole or in part and must set forth the specific grounds on which it is based. These grounds may include the following:

- (1) The utility did not properly serve or give notice of the advice letter;
- (2) The relief requested in the advice letter would violate statute or Commission order, or is not authorized by statute or Commission order on which the utility relies;
- (3) The analysis, calculations, or data in the advice letter contain material error or omissions;
- (4) The relief requested in the advice letter is pending before the Commission in a formal proceeding; or
- (5) The relief requested in the advice letter requires consideration in a formal hearing, or is otherwise inappropriate for the advice letter process; or
- (6) The relief requested in the advice letter is unjust, unreasonable, or discriminatory (provided that such a protest may not be made where it would require relitigating a prior order of the Commission.)

A protest shall provide citations or proofs where available to allow staff to properly consider the protest.

A response or protest must be made in writing or by electronic mail and must be received by the Water Division within 20 days of the date this advice letter is filed. The address for mailing or delivering a protest is:


