# Fundamental Policy Questions

- Does outdoor seating affect demand for water?
   i.e. Who fills that seat and what was the customer going to do in the alternative?
- If demand in the District is not increased, does the individual site merit permit requirements?
- Is the District's role to balance water demand against available supply, or is it to permit activities on a site?

### Site-By-Site Issues

- Does a restaurant have "underutilized" capacity within its existing permit? (Is new water needed?)
- Clarity has value Need to state a policy
- What to do about locations without an existing water permit
- What to do about locations with existing outdoor seats
- What to do about projects in planning
- Consider effect on Credits, as well

#### Option 1

- Require new outdoor seating to obtain Water Permit
  - "Grandfather" existing outdoor seating
  - Issue a Water Permit to each existing restaurant
    - Require permits for future outdoor seating increases
  - Consider allowing a percentage of interior seats for outdoor use (e.g. 25%), or a specific number (e.g. 20 seats)
  - Determine Water Use Capacity of outdoor seating
  - Suggest an implementation date
  - Projects in progress recommendation
  - Discuss Best Management Practices as offset

#### Option 2

- Require Water Permits for existing outdoor seating installed between 1985 & present
  - Jurisdiction authorizes water from Allocation
  - On-Site Water Credit to offset outdoor seats
  - Demonstrate actual use within Water Use
     Capacity based on indoor seating

#### Option 3

- Maintain (but clarify) current practice
  - No intensification in use
  - Use is within existing Water Use Capacity
  - People choose to sit inside or outside
  - Restaurants do not operate at capacity every day
  - Must clarify current practice regarding both permits and credits

## Summary

 Option 1: "Grandfather" existing seating and require Water Permits going forward

 Option 2: Require a Water Permit for all outdoor seating utilizing an Allocation or Credit

 Option 3: Do not require a Water Permit for outdoor seating
