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Cal-Am Application

Cal-Am seeks California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) approve to sign a Water Purchase Agreement to buy water from the Pure Water Monterey Groundwater Replenishment Project.

Cal-Am also asks the CPUC to approve cost recovery for infrastructure improvements associated with PWM expansion.

The CPUC asks the Parties to update supply and demand estimates for Cal-Am's previously approved Monterey Peninsula Water Supply Project (MPWSP).

Administration of the Proceeding

• Commissioner Darcie L. Houck is assigned to this case.

Commissioner Houck was appointed to the CPUC in 2021 and was a CPUC ALJ from 2016 to 2019.

• ALJ Zita Kline is also assigned to this case.

• ALJ Kline had also been assigned to MPWMD's Complaint against Cal-Am, C.21-05-005.

Parties to the CPUC Process

ALJ Zita Kline held a prehearing conference on January 25, 2022.

Decision Criteria

This is a ratemaking proceeding.

Hearings will resolve material disputed factual matters (if any).

To authorize the WPA it must be shown the Project is reasonable, prudent, and in the public interest.

Phases for the Proceeding

Commissioner Houck issued a Scoping Memo on February 9, 2022

The case will have two phases:

Phase 1 addresses approval of the Amended WPA and cost recovery

Phase 2 addresses long term water supply and demand estimates

MPWMD written testimony is due on March 11 and April 1, 2022.
