## When re-opening occurs...

- The Governor has prioritized moving business outdoors to the extent possible
- District Rule 24 regulates outdoor restaurant seats
  - OK to have 1/2 the number of indoor seats outside w/o permit requirement
- Jurisdictions have begun discussing ways to facilitate outdoor dining
  - Indoor space restrictions limit ability to social distance
  - Public space, driveways, parking lots, alleyways, etc.

## Summary of Ordinance No. 186

- District's rule does not address the potential need to temporarily relocate seating from inside to outside as will occur with re-opening Restaurants during the pandemic
- Urgency Ordinance No. 186 facilitates outdoor seating
- Restaurants will need to confirm that the District has a seat count, but no Water Permit will be required
- All action subject to approval by the jurisdiction

## Recommendation

- The Board should adopt Ordinance No. 186 with urgency to address an immediate need for outdoor seating when re-opening is allowed
- Urgency Ordinance expires after one year
- Staff will share process with restaurants & Jurisdictions
