WATER MANAGEMENT DISTRICT BOARD MEMBER TO RESIGN, MOVE TO EAST COAST

Replacement for Division 3 Seat Sought Immediately

Monterey, Calif., December 21, 2020 — Molly Evans, Monterey Peninsula Water Management District Director from Division 3 has announced her resignation from the Board effective December 15, 2020, due to a relocation to the East Coast. The Division 3 seat, which represents most of Monterey was not scheduled to open for election again until November of 2024. The Water Management District (MPWMD) will accept letters of interest and statements of qualifications from interested persons that reside within Division 3 until Wednesday, January 20, 2020 at 5pm. If there is agreement on a qualified candidate, the Board of Directors will deliberate on the selection of an appointee at the January 28, 2020 special board meeting.

If appointed, the new Director would be required to run for the then-remaining two years of the term in November 2022.

Interested candidates should submit their materials via email to Sara@mpwmd.net or via regular mail to MPWMD, PO Box 85, Monterey, CA 93942. The MPWMD Board retains its right to review all qualified candidates and decide instead to call an election.

Her knowledge of water and her wisdom regarding working toward collective goals will surely be missed.”
